- Greece is a country in Europe.
- Greece is located in Southern Europe, between Albania and Turkey.
- It borders the Aegean Sea, Ionian Sea and the Mediterranean Sea
- The coast is the land along a sea. The boundary of a coast, where land meets water, is called the coastline.
- A peninsula is a piece of land that is almost entirely surrounded by water but is connected to the mainland on one side.
- Greece consists of a large mainland, two smaller peninsulas and a large number of islands. Some of the most well-known islands include Crete, Rhodes and Corfu.
- 80% of Greece is mountainous.
- The capital city of Greece is Athens.
- The climate of Greece is primarily Mediterranean (mild winters and hot, dry summers).
- Mount Olympus is the tallest mountain in Greece.
- Topography is the study of the forms and features of land surfaces.
- Topographical maps show the topography of an area.
